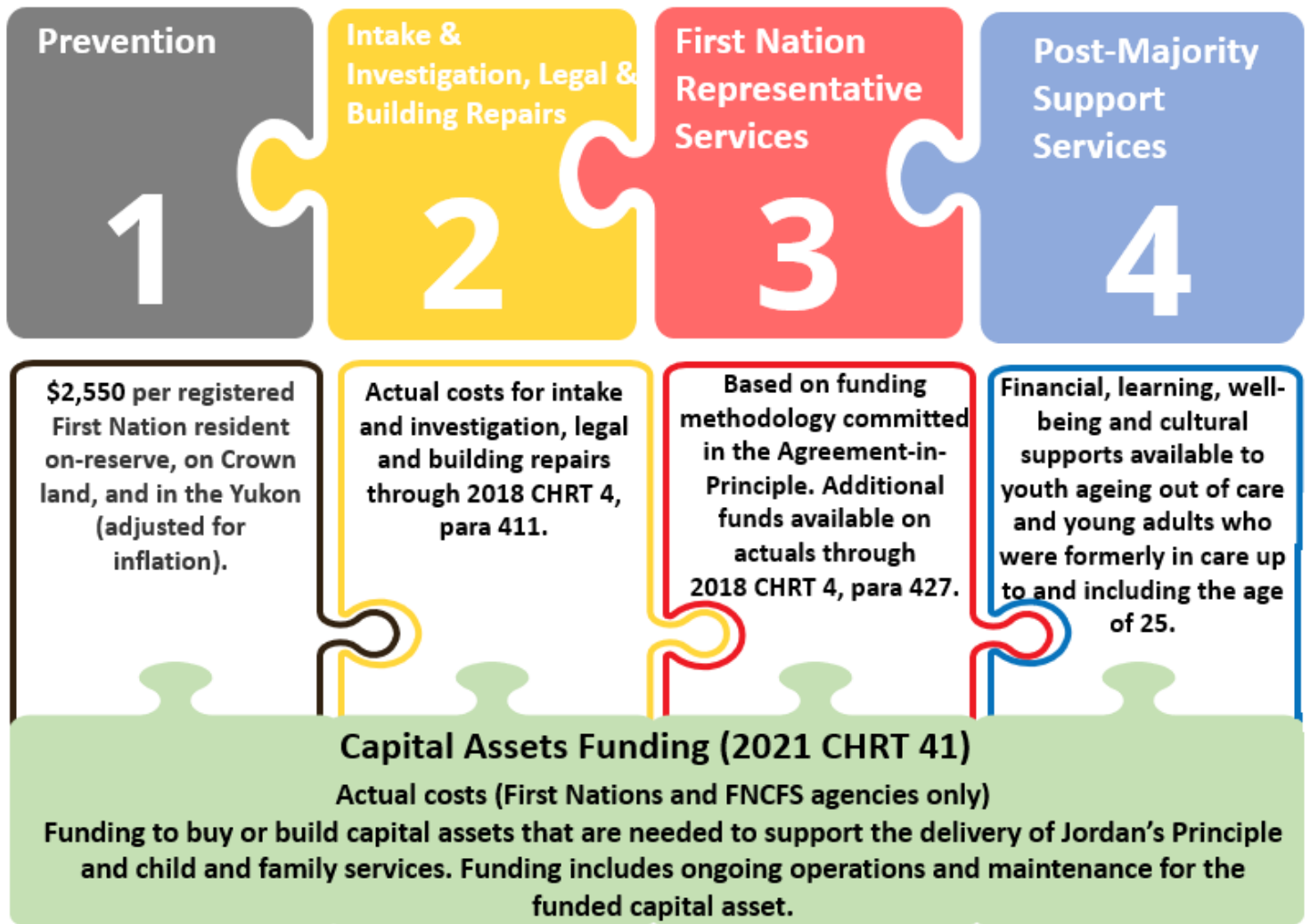

An Act respecting First Nations, Inuit and Métis Children, youth and families

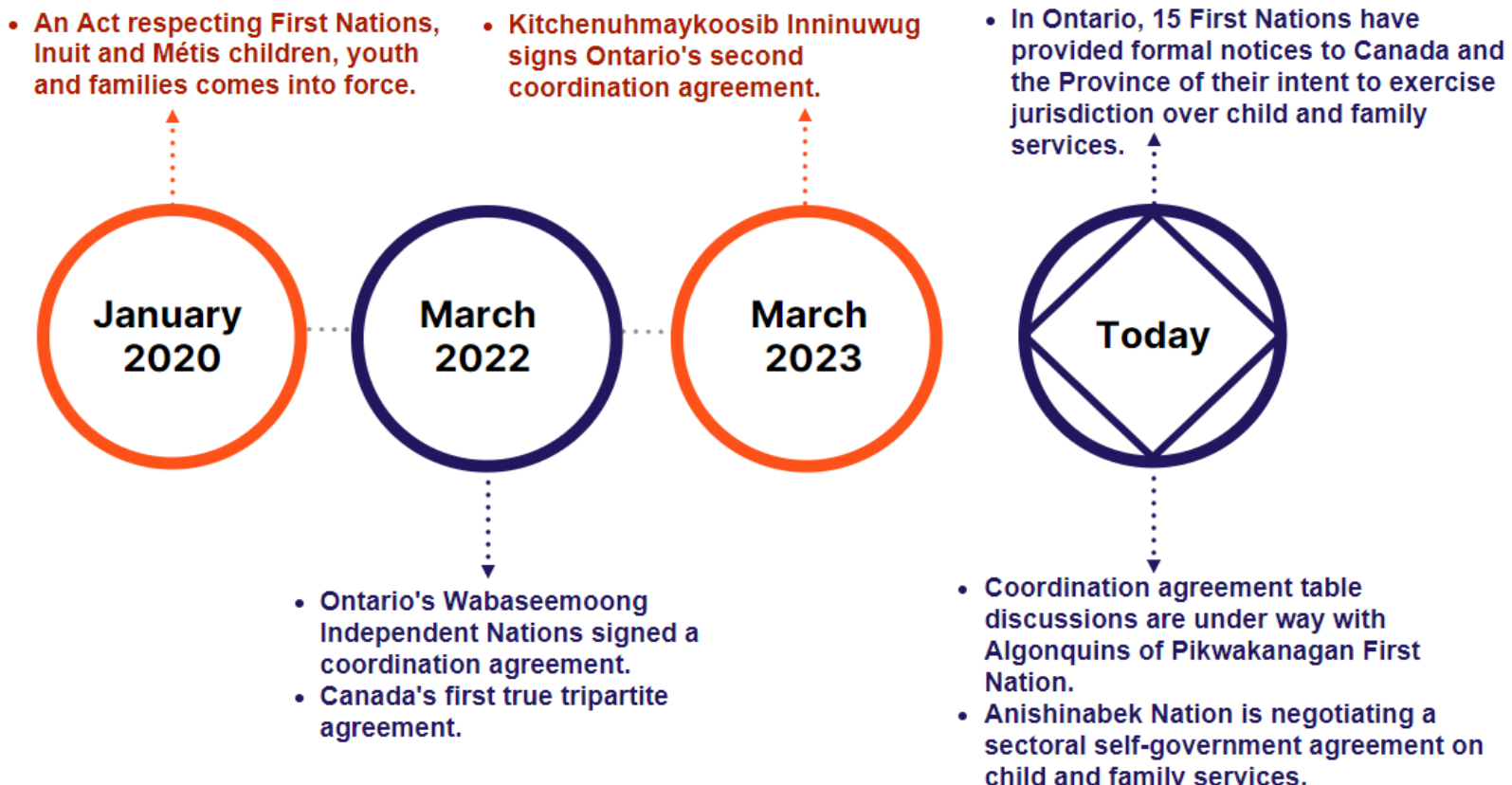
The Act (Bill C-92) affirms the right of First Nations, Inuit, and Métis to exercise their inherent jurisdiction over child and family services.

Capacity-Building Funding

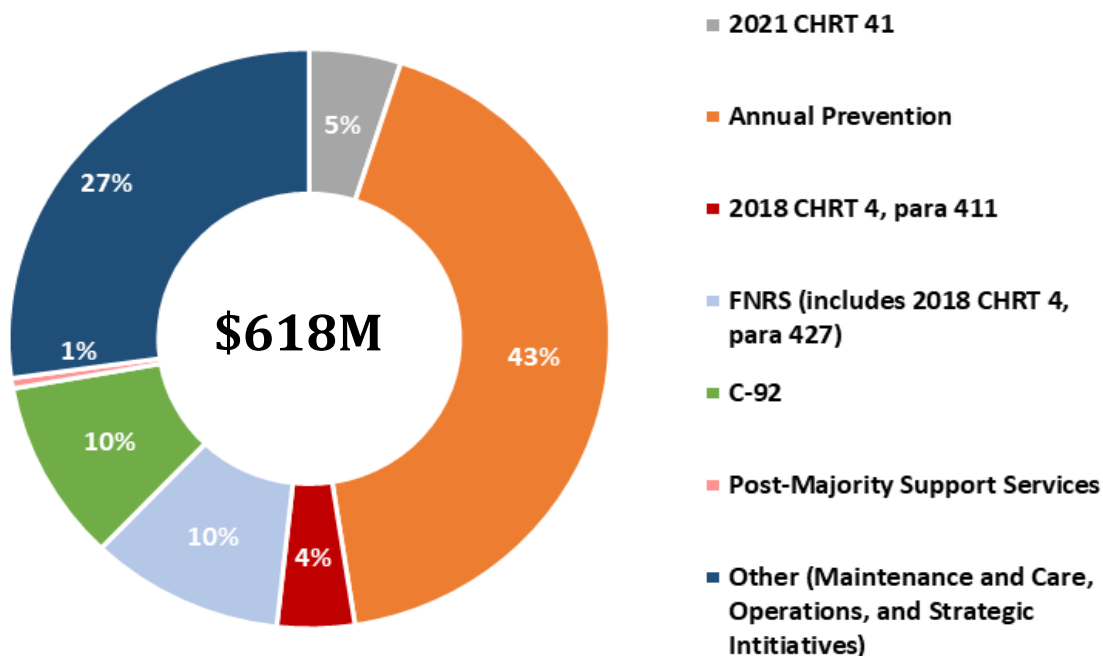
ISC provides proposal-based capacity-building funding to First Nations and groups to explore readiness to exercise jurisdiction, and to develop Indigenous child and family services laws and service models.

Coordination Agreement

A Coordination Agreement is a tripartite agreement between 3 levels of jurisdiction to facilitate the implementation of the Indigenous jurisdiction that is already affirmed in the Act by articulating the roles and responsibilities of the Parties.
