

## The First Nations Data Governance Strategy – Background Highlights

A First Nations-led Solution Mandated by Rights Holders

### **AFN RESOLUTION #57/2016**

### **Funding for Regional Information Governance Centres**

Coordination of First Nations regions, data governance champions and national partners to establish a national First Nations data governance strategy.

### Federal Budget 2018

### \$2.5 million to FNIGC and its partners to:

- A. Design aNational Data Governance Strategy
- B. Coordinate the establishment of Regional Information Governance Centres (RIGC)

### MARCH 2020 – TABLING OF STRATEGY

FNIGC and its partners delivered the comprehensive report entitled A First Nations Data Governance Strategyarticulating key outcomes and benefits for First Nations and Canada with strong linkages with Canada's priorities and commitments.

### Federal Budget 2021


\$81.5 million to support atransformational approach to Indigenous Da\$5 (1.5 million to FNIGC and its partners continue the development and implementation of a First Nations Data Governance Strategy)

## A FIRST NATIONS DATA GOVERNANCE STRATEGY

Anchored in a robust strategic framework with:

- A clear vision and path for achieving data sovereignty
- A set of First Nationsuiding principles
- Nine strategic pillarswhere capacities must be built





## FULLY FUNCTIONAL REGIONAL INFORMATION GOVERNANCE CENTRE – A GENERIC MODEL

End goal is to establish a network of expert based non-political Information Governance Centres across Canada that will provide shared data and statistical services to First Nations communities, their governments, and their service delivery organizations including:

- STATISTICAL PRODUCTION SERVICES
- DATA MANAGEMENT SERVICES
- DATA CAPACITY BUILDING SERVICES



## IMPLEMENTATION APPROACH

- A multi-year undertaking with a phased approach (3+ year increments)
- Community-driven
- Every region to advance at its own pace
- National objectives set for coherence
- Data Champions Teams in 2022-23

PHASE 1 (2022 – 25)

Define priority needs and secure leadership endorsement

- Establish national and regional Data Champion Teams
- Define blueprints for non-political regional data governance bodies
- Identify priority capacity building needs at the regional, and national levels

PHASE 2 (2025 – 28)

Implement Phase 1 priority needs

- Building technical and human infrastructure and regional data governance bodies
- Begin leveraging the new data capacities

PHASE 3 (≥ 2028)

Expand & Optimize
Data Center
Network

- Expand capacity needs based on leadership priorities
- Manage interoperability and collaboration across network
